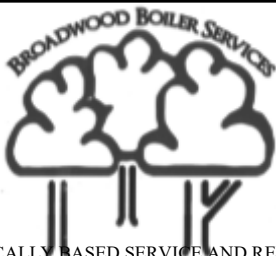

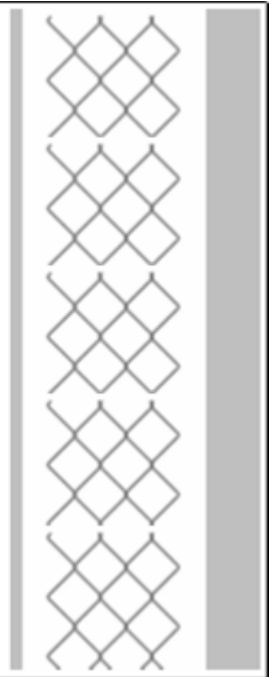

Speed Watch needs your help

This month speedwatch has been active and we have found times of the day when the offending is very high. An example of this is in one session where 111 vehicles passing to the west had 10 in excess of 46mph with one topping the offenders at 64mph past Lewtrenchard School.

At the time of writing we have just completed a session with 98 vehicles passing to the west with 17 offenders, 2 being recorded doing 60mph passed the school.

The group needed more volunteers to be able be more visible and active at educating drivers. This will also help collate data that we can use to build the case to get Devon County Highways to put in measures to reduce speed though our growing village hopefully before someone is killed or seriously injured by the very poor driving and lack of respect for the residents of the village.

We badly need more active volunteers to ease the burden on the operators of the group.

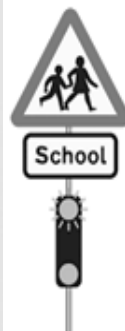

Minutes of meeting No 698 held on Tuesday 13th July

1. Members of the public open forum – one parishioner was present who then proceeded to introduce himself and expressed an interest in the councillor vacancy.
2. Dispensations & declarations of interest – Cllr Hennessey and the clerk P. van Delft for item 7.
3. Minutes of previous meetings 696 & 697 were signed by the chair as a true and accurate record of those meetings. Proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis and seconded by Cllr Roberts
4. Planning Ref 1726/21/FUL, Erection of agricultural barn, Address – Lowertown, Sprytown, PL16 0AY
Council decision: Support- proposed by Cllr Law, seconded by Cllr Lorna St Louis

Planning Ref 2552/21/HHO, Householder application for the removal of existing pitched and flat roofs and construction of roof to form first floor living. Address – Dell view, Newton Down, Lifton, PL16 0AS,
Council decision: Support – proposed by Cllr Hennessey, seconded by Cllr Law.

5. Cllr Edmonds of WDBC reported that the ‘Mobile, Broadband Booster Scheme’ was now available, vouchers worth £800 was available from registered providers. WDBC is developing a long-term strategic wide-ranging plan for West Devon, this is being developed in association with DCC, NHS and other organisations, consultation commences on 21st July for 6 weeks, visit the WDBC to submit your comments. Launch date is anticipated in September.
6. Reports from councillors: Cllr Leroy St Louis reported that councillors who have not attended a planning training course may find it useful to attend one. The use of the Lewdown PC projector for helping to determine planning applications could be beneficial, clerk to enquire if hiring the equipment is possible and what cost. A complaint involving the erection of garages had been received, Cllr Edmonds suggested that it may be a ‘permitted development’. Some rocks and debris had been spilt by vehicles using the highway between the A30 and the C822. What road works were scheduled? The councillor wanted greater accountability from D.H, Cllr Edmonds suggested the use of ‘Customer Services’ at D.H. An enquiry if WDBC are due to provide ‘wheely bins’ in the future, Cllr Edmonds confirmed this was not the case. Cllr Law updated members with developments from the PCC, live video of ‘Dog kidnapping’ taking place and it is

increasing country wide. Police commissioner has managed to secure greater resources for identifying speeding vehicles. Cllr Roberts informed that two parishioners had cleaned up the bus shelter at Portgate, the chair to write a letter of thanks. Cllr Hennessey reported that the Parish Village Committee are to hold a BBQ on Saturday 14th August, 12-4pm Entry is £5.00 this includes burger, a soft drink & pudding.

7. Refurbishment of the parish hall. Cllr Hennessey (Chair of the Village Hall Committee) reported that it would like to see the village hall improved with some much need refurbishment. Replacement of worn-out kitchen & rotten kitchen door, remove existing heating and lighting and replace with efficient heating and lighting, install outdoor seating and tables. Cllr Hennessey asked if the Parish Council could apply for a grant(s) for the improvements, if there was a shortfall in funding then the V.H.C. would donate the balance needed to complete the work. The V.H.C. believe that the changes will enhance its attraction to more users that require a cost-effective venue whilst also providing multipurpose facilities. Cllr Hennessey and the clerk were asked to leave the meeting whilst the remaining council considered the proposal. It was resolved that the council did feel that the proposal from V.H.C for the much needed work was appropriate, it was thought that the V.H. was an important building for the community providing a valuable service for its parishioners. The council requires at least two quotations for each item that needed to be replaced. The cost forecast for the work as identified was estimated to be £8,226 + vat. The motion was proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis and seconded by Cllr Law, unanimous decision.
8. Facebook - Parish council page update. Cllr Leroy St Louis reported that at least 2 people were required to manage the page. Cllr Lorna St Louis and Cllr Law offered to see what was needed despite not having much experience.
9. 75 year Remembrance Tree – Unfortunately no responses were received from the Newslink advert. The warden of St John suggested that an Oak tree could be planted in the square adjacent to the church, this suggestion was also supported by the rector Rev. Philip Conway. It was resolved to purchase an Oak tree and for it to be planted in the square. A plaque for that tree and also that of the 50 year tree and the 25 year tree should also be made.
10. Bus shelter – Maintenance and repair - Cllrs Leroy and Lorna St Louis will undertake the work in August.
11. Councillor vacancy. Mr Rees Kenyon expressed an interest in becoming a councillor, it was resolved to co-opt Mr Kenyon, proposed Cllr Roberts, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis.
12. Correspondence – Road closures complaint, this item was addressed in item 6. Date time and place of next scheduled meeting - 14th September 2021 – 7.30pm at Stowford Parish Hall

Minutes of Extraordinary meeting No 699 held on Tuesday 10th August

These abbreviated minutes are provisional until they are signed by the chair at the next meeting of the parish council.

1. Dispensations & declarations of interest – The clerk declared an interest in item 6 and wished to be excused whilst it is deliberated. Cllr Hennessey and the clerk declared an interest in item 8, Cllr Hennessey did not vote on the motion.
2. Minutes of previous meetings 699 was signed by the chair as a true and accurate record of the meeting. Proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded By Cllr Dunn.
3. Planning Ref – 0384/21/FUL Retrospective change of use of land from agriculture to domestic Garden, to include garden room, and wildlife pond. Address – Portgate Chapel, Lewdown, EX20 4PZ
Council decision – Support, proposed by Cllr Dunn, Seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis. One abstention.
4. Reports from councillors – Cllr Law reported that the police were experiencing a surge in scams including vaccine scams. Cllr Dunn reported that the problem of speeding vehicles was getting worse on the C822. After much deliberation it was resolved that Cllr Dunn draft a letter to the local MP, also to the police & crime commissioner and Devon Highways. Cllr Roberts reported that hedgerows entering the village were becoming overgrown, Cllr Leroy St Louis to report to D.H. Cllr Edmonds (WDBC) reported that the ‘Plan for Devon’ consultation period was still open. Airband have identified local properties that are eligible for broadband full fibre connection if so required.
5. Refurbishment and repairs to the parish hall, Grant applications – It was resolved to support two applications, the WDBC Community Grant Scheme, proposed by Cllr Law, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis, also the DC.C. Reconnect, Rebuild, Recover Fund, proposed by Cllr Kenyon, seconded Cllr Roberts. Clerk to submit applications.
6. Stowford Village Hall Committee – Lease extension for a further 13 months. It was resolved to approve the extension to 7th October 2022, proposed Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Law.
7. Projector + equipment - hire for planning application consultations – hire costs + insurance undertaking. The clerk reported that Lewdown G.P.C. would charge £5.00 per day, insurance undertaking was required by Stowford PC. It was resolved to accept the charge, proposed by Cllr Kenyon, seconded by Cllr Roberts. Cllr Dunn objected.

1. Speed-limits and safety on the C822 – update. An email from Cllr Samuel (DCC) provided a disappointing response from Devon highways to the councils request to extend the D.H. proposed speed limit from the cricket field to beyond the school. It was resolved to ask the clerk to arrange a zoom meeting with DCC and DH, the purpose is to understand their decision and to find how this issue can progress further forward. A speed-watch session recorded a vehicle speeding at 66mph.
2. Planning – Ref 1961/21/HHO – Householder app for rear single storey extension and single extension for home office and garden store. Address – Ikhaya, Crossroads, Lewdown, EX20 4DP,
Council decision – Support - proposed Cllr Metherell, seconded Cllr Vanstone
Planning – Ref 1617/21/FUL – Demolition of existing pole barn and replacement with a single storey building for ancillary accommodation. Address – Pole Barn at Higher Cholwell, Lewdown, EX20 4BX
Council decision – Refuse – Proposed Cllr Perkins, seconded Cllr Metherell, one councillor abstained.
Planning - Ref 2391/21/HHO – Householder application for proposed extension and alterations, Address – Holster Yard, Lewdown, EX20 4BS, Council decision – Support – proposed Cllr Vanstone, seconded Cllr Wilkinson.
Planning – Ref 0384/21/FUL - Retrospective change of use of land from agriculture to domestic garden to include garden room and wildlife pond. Address, Land adjacent to Portgate Chapel, Lewdown, EX20 4PZ . The clerk asked to be excused from this application whilst being considered. Council decision – Support – Cllr Perkins, seconded Cllr Yeo.
3. Reports from councillors – It was reported that the WI was having a Cream Tea on 9th August with the aim of raising funds for the nature trail, a temporary sign for the event to be erected at the memorial square. Cllr Crocker reported that the bench at East Raddon was in a state of disrepair, it was resolved that the Baring Gauld estate manager is contacted. Cllr Andrews reported that the Queens jubilee next year should be celebrated with the council planting of a tree, possibly at the Ramps. Cllr Southcott reported that the Cross-Roads building development had “Non-Compliance of discharge of conditions notice” issued, this relates to drainage and flooding issues from the site.

4. The ramps – plans/planning & fundraising update, bench repairs. – Cllr Perkins provided a quotation for play equipment, an additional quotation is to be sought. A planning application will need to be submitted. A working party to help Cllr Perkins with the project includes Cllr Southcott, and Cllr Wilkinson. 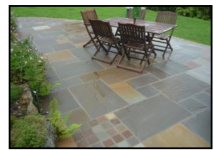
