



Reflections of a Steam Fireman

On the 14th June 1965 British Railway introduce the 24 hour clock, on the first day confusion especially the afternoon shift I turn up for 3pm spare to find I was on at 1300hrs no drama just a



small lecture from the running foreman, the timekeeper put the old times next to the 24hour one and peace prevailed in the loco, just to confuse a bit more the three shift system was abolish and a two shift system introduced early turn was from 0001 to 1159 late turn was 1201 to 2359 and a steam driver could only be moved two hours either side of allotted time, not so lucky for junior fireman who could start on Monday 0001 and end up on Saturday 1159 if they were short in the London area for fireman working coaches from Clapham to Waterloo with a small tank

Engine, I did not mind but when you tell the girlfriend we were able to go to Barn Dance on Saturday in East Meon because you were Early turn and then to say you were not able to go because you were working not so good!

At about this time, I was walking to the running shed to prepare a U class 2-6-0 and there was a gentleman with an easel painting and introduce himself as David Sheppard, I thought he painted Elephants, but he was passionate about Steam engines, he said Jumbos had made him a lot of money.

The Shed master wanted to clean up the loco he was painting, but he said I would like capture it as it is, the drivers on our shift took to him taking him out with us, on our engine, he would capture the moment and then go back to his studio in Godalming and finish the canvas off.

Then on a dry day he would set up his easel with the new painting by the Shed Masters Office for the loco staff to look at, he seem to prefer our shift and invited us to his house



for Sunday tea and chat, i unfortunately could not go as I was in London on a tank engine, yes Clapham to Waterloo empty carriage stock, the drivers and fireman said they had a great time especially as his wife and ladies friend served tea.

When the LMR did not work out in Longmoor, his two engine were moved to Eastleigh and then moved to Cranbrook, which he and friends purchased the East Somerset line in Cranbrook Somerset.

Driver Boxhall organised in 1984 a special from our depot in Woking to Cranbrook pulled by two Cromptons 1550hp and Pat and I were invited to join them and David walk through the coaches talking to us, when we arrive at Cranbrook we walked to villager hall and David gave a lecture on his life and his preserved railway we then were taken along his preserved railway pulled by the green Knight a 4mt 4-6-0 standard Steam Engine

After that he sat in the Signal box with paintings for sale signing and we purchased one of a school class 4-4-0, we were fed and watered and it was a grand day out.

Cocktail of the Month 'Berry Fizz' Perfect for Mother's Day

Fruity and fresh, Berry Fizz cocktail is simple to make but big on flavour!

YOU WILL NEED:

- 250ml Raspberry Lemonade
- 35ml Pink Gin
- 20ml Lime Juice
- 6 Raspberries

METHOD:

Muddle (lightly mash) 4
Raspberries gently at the bottom of a Rocks (short tumbler) glass.
Add your Pink Gin and Lime Juice to a cocktail shaker.



Shake with ice, strain into the glass, then top with the Raspberry Lemonade. Swizzle, and garnish with the remaining Raspberries and a twist of Lime.

from Bradworthy, Buckland Brewer & Clawton were all brilliant and a testament to what yfc is all about. However we did have a




cheerleading team joint with Clawton (comprised from lewdown of Charlie Crocker,

No.9 - Setsubun: Out with devil, in with happiness

February 2nd this year was Setsubun, the Spring Equinox, in Japan, the first day of spring on the old Japanese calendar, and a day which is a known for its yearly tradition of throwing beans out of windows while a devil stalks around the outside of the house.

As usual, the devil was me, dressed in a paper mask sold in the local 7Eleven, while my wife and daughter tossed bags of soy beans (easier to clean up than individual beans) out of each window while I stumbled around in the dark, trying to avoid any devilish behaviour such as tripping over flowerbeds or hobbling myself on any low-lying walls.

After the bean throwing was done, we all went inside to eat "eho-maki", a long roll of sushi that usually contains cucumber, spiced beef, egg, ginger, and rice, and is wrapped in a large piece of seaweed. 

Abbreviated minutes of Ordinary meetings held on 14th January 2026
These minutes are provisional until they are signed by the chair at the next meeting of the parish council.

Meeting No 730

Present: Clirs Leroy St Louis (Chair), Judy Law (Vice Chair), Richard Alexander, John Govett, Lorna St Louis.
P van Delft (clerk)

- Minutes of previous meeting 729 were signed as a true and accurate record of that meeting. Proposed Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Alexander, all in favour.
- 2. Table Tennis Council initiative to help with health & fitness. Purchase of equipment. The Parish Council has received a kind donation of a table from a parishioner. The council had received a £150 W.D.B.C. grant for a second table tennis table, the chair informed that he was unsuccessful in bidding for a table but would continue to review availability for a suitable used table. The p.c. is now looking for someone who will lead the table tennis sessions, anyone interested to contact the chair or the clerk.
- Finance 3.1 Payments were approved for P van Delft clerk salary (Nov/Dec) £388.73, HMRC PAYE for clerk £25.40,
 - Cllr L. St Louis refund electricity cost for meeting £6.00. Proposed Cllr Alexander, seconded Cllr Law, all in favour.
 - 3.2 R.F.O. Reported a credit balance of £5220.51 after approved payments, proposed Cllr Govett, seconded Cllr Leroy St Louis, all in favour. 3.3 Bank change Hinckley & Rugby Building Society application and resolution. The R.F.O. informed that the H&R BS provided free banking. After due consideration, it was resolved to approve the proposal from the Hinkley & Rugby Building Society, the Resolution was signed by current authorised signatories who have all agreed to continue. Motion proposed Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Alexander, all in favour. 3.4 Budget 2025-26 + Precept 2025-26 The R.F.O. provided two draft budgets for consideration, It was resolved to approve a balanced budget of £3740. A precept of £3740 to be requested from W.D.B.C. Motion proposed Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded Cllr Alexander, all in favour. 7.5. Grant applications processing and determination It was resolved to approve the following grant applications; Lewdown Residents Association (Newslink) £200, Stowford St John graveyard maintenance grant £200, Portgate Methodist graveyard Graveyard maintenance grant £100. Payments to be made after approval at the next meeting. Motion proposed Cllr Govett, seconded Cllr Alexander, all in favour.
- 4. Reports from Cllr Edmonds of WDBC The chair received a report provided by Cllr Edmonds. Patrols have been conducted weekly except during the Christmas period. An instance of a dog off lead was identified on 28th November, Further patrols will continue to monitor the situation.
- 5. Nuisance dog off lead update including Mobile Liaison Officer response. The chair reiterated that patrols from the M.L.O. were still taking place. The chair confirmed that Cllr Edmonds and the clerk would continue to be updated with issues arising. The meeting went into Part 2, 8.16pm and finished 8.18pm, no members of the public were present.
- Reports from Councillors Cllr Govett suggested that should the Governments proposed devolution white
 paper become law then local councils may have to think differently, this could also have impacts on how
 grant aid is considered for interested bodies.
- 7. Parish Councillors vacancies The chair reported that an individual maybe interested, also Cllr Law confirmed that a local parishioner may also be interested, both councillors will report back at the next meeting. Cllr Leroy St Louis reported that a complaint of speeding vehicles was received, the councillor did mention that the issue of speeding vehicles was raised at a meeting in 2024 but no interest from parishioners were received on that matter.
- 8. Parish Questionnaire draft questions and reply box. After much discussion it was resolved that the chair would prepare a new draft questionnaire. Questionnaire to be hand delivered by councillors, copies also to be made available at the coffee mornings and quiz nights (by agreement) Responses can be dropped in at the Parish Hall letter box, all other responses to be collected from parishioners after 14 days of postal by councillors. 



The Life of a Model Railway Buff

Part 2: I took early retirement in 2010 and my other half, who was still working from home and didn't need distracting, declared "You need to get a hobby". After many years of not playing trains. I decided to take them down from the loft, dust them off and set them up again. I built a large layout in the spare bedroom. It was waist height, went all the way around the room and had a hinged section I could lift up to get in the middle. Soon after I started we found we needed to move house so back in the boxes it all went and we moved to Lewdown. With no spare room available I was sure I would never be able to set them up again but a brainwave to reconfigure the garage led to the setup I have today. Knowing it would take me years to design and build such a huge layout I decided to contact a specialist in Somerset that I had found on the internet. After several design meetings the layout was delivered and installed in January 2020. The current layout is "U" shaped and is 12' long by 8' wide. The trains run on 3 levels. So much has changed in the technology that now the trains are controlled by a DCC chip in the engine talking to wiring buses communicating with software on the computer via WIFI. The engines can be programmed to make sounds such as whistles, steam releasing, platform announcements, carriages coupling and be set to run specific routes that stop at stations, sidings and junctions.

Gardening Jobs For March

As the weather begins to turn, and the first signs of spring appear, March is a great month to begin the first sowings of hardy/early crops. So this month, I've prepared a short guide with some of my key tips for sowing seeds.

Using module trays

The only seeds I sow direct are carrots and parsnips. For everything else, I sow seeds into module trays and bring the young plants on in the shelter of a grow house/cold frame. The young plants are then transplanted into the ground (often less than a month later).



There are a number of key benefits to this method, which include being able to start seeds off earlier than you would be able to sow them direct and you can sow into more modules than you need, giving you some back up plants to replace the inevitable slug victims.

Multi sowing

This is a method of sowing seeds, whereby you sow more than one seed into each module of the tray. You then end up with a little clump of seedlings (say four or five) which can be planted out together without disturbing the group.

This method works particularly well for things like onions, beetroot and radish. You can sow a few more seeds than you would like plants, and thin out a few before planting. This also helps to cover any seeds that don't germinate and ensure you still end up with a full clump ready to plant out.

As the individual vegetables grow, you can harvest the smallest plants first by simply twisting them out and leaving the remainers to grow on.

Quick fire tips

- Be patient, and don't sow the seeds of heat loving crops like climbing beans, sweetcorn and squashes for at least another month. Otherwise you will have plants which are ready to go out well before the weather is right
- Find a sowing compost that works for you, different garden centres offer different products and I like to make my own mix with a combination of multi purpose compost sieved with a little 'seed sowing compost'
- Most seeds need warmth to germinate, whereas seedlings need light, so make sure you have a setup which can offer these two key elements depending on what stage your plants are at


