



Ordinary meeting No 691 held on Tuesday 12th January

- Stowford Tithe/Rental document case Currently the document is protected with a supermarket plastic bag. Council considered a quotation for the supply and purchase of a protective case. It was resolved to accept the quotation of £85 for the supply of the protective case. Cllr Edmonds kindly offered to support the project and suggested that money from the Locality fund could be available to help with the purchase. Proposed Cllr Dunn and seconded Cllr Law. Clerk to apply.
- 2. R.F.O. Reported a current account credit balance of £5189.14 after approval of payments Proposed Cllr Dunn, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis. Draft budget considerations for 2021/22+ setting of the 2021 precept request. After discussion it was resolved to approve the budget of £2926. Cllr Bowers recommended that should an overspend of over £250 arise then an analysis of the ongoing costs should take place. Proposed Cllr Bowers, seconded Cllr Hennessey.
- 3. Councillor reports: Councillor Lorna St Louis reported that she received a complaint over dog fouling around Stowford. Cllr Bowers suggested the use of cctv to identify offenders. Cllr Edmonds suggested the use of strategically placed **Clean it Up**" signs in area's most affected. Cllr Edmonds also suggested the use of the locality officer who could occasionally patrol the village at various times to catch offending dog owners. Also considered was the purchase of dog waste bins and the use of the WDBC waste removal service, however the purchase of the bin and the annual service charge was thought too prohibitive. Cllr Leroy St Louis reported of the Stowford Church success of staging the bi-annual Christmas tree display outside the church. The display raised £264, the proceeds will be equally split between the Childrens Society and Stowford PCC. The chair wanted to thank Cllr Hennessey for donating the Council trees and all the councillors for contributing towards the purchase of the decorations for the tree. A great effort was made by all involved to support the church and charity.
- 4. WDBC Cllr Edmonds reported that Highways was contacted regarding the excess water from Sprytown cross towards Tinhay, the problem stretch was inspected, work to clear the drains will be in next the financial years budget. Page 16

Cllrs should inspect the grit bins for stock levels, top-ups can be provided by highways. WDBC Covid 19 response to help local businesses especially in providing government grants has been very successful. Community support groups have been working well.

- 5. Remembrance Day 75 years tree ClIr Hennessey suggested the clIrs Christmas tree decorations contributions surplus of £22.10 could go towards the purchase of a tree. ClIr Leroy St Louis suggested that parishioners may wish to choose what type of tree and where it could be planted. It was resolved to support the motion, proposed ClIr Leroy St Louis, seconded ClIr Bowers. ClIr Leroy St Louis offered to plant the tree. ClIr Dunn reminded the council that a tree maintenance program should be in place to ensure the longevity of the tree's life.
- 6. Facebook Council presence on the media platform. Cllr Leroy St Louis updated the council with his progress, it was thought that a draft could be in place in 2-3 weeks.

back to the next meeting when a full council is present.

5. Correspondence - A parishioner complaint was received regarding damage to highways verges in Stowford parish, earth/soil waste nuisance on the highway through the c822 and Portgate Hill, through to Allerford Farm, environmental concerns and breaches of planning applications. It was reported that the parish council had limited powers in such matters, however all the relevant authorities have been notified and are aware of the complaints, the complaint is currently being investigated.



Minute No 734 Ordinary meeting held on Monday 25th January 2021

- 1. Speeding and Safety concerns on the C822 A parishioner wished to know what progress the council was making since the virtual meeting with highways in November. The parishioner also stated that a pedestrian hit by a vehicle at 40mph has a 90% chance of very serious injury or death but at 30mph this is reduced to 20% chance of serious injury or death. Cllr Ball who was unavailable to attend did forward an explanation for the slow progress that this issue has taken to resolve. After much deliberation it was resolved to action several points in readiness of an extraordinary meeting to be held on 22nd February, Proposed Cllr Harrop, seconded Cllr Southcott. Action points include :-
- a) Signing review Speed-limiting measures Action D.H.
- b) Further speed data A review of when the next survey will be undertaken, this must be after the current lockdown restrictions have been lifted – PC to obtain agreement with D.H
- c) Plan to identify frontages on the highway Action:- Cllr Southcott to identify properties throughout Lewdown. D.H to provide a definition of a road frontage for a village. Action:- councillors to identify other villages with similar speed limit
- Possible removal of centre line at narrower section near the Blue Lion P.C concerns over safety should this take place. D.H. to provide data that suggests this would make this a safer environment on the highway. Action:- D.H.
- e) Village gateway improvements ClIrs Southcott, Wilkinson and Yeo have created a draft plan this to be circulated prior to the next meeting. Action:- ClIr Southcott
- f) Lining review D.H. to provide a draft plan and data that supports this safety measure.
- 2. Finance: Report from R.F.O. showed a combined credit balance of £18,624.16 after approval of proposed payment of invoices.
- 3. Councillor reports: Cllr Wilkinson reported he had a meeting with a tree surgeon regarding the fallen ash tree at the Ramps, they concluded that the tree should not be removed, no other trees showed visible signs of disease. Cllr Wilkinson also reported that excess stones and ground waste had been

removed from the highway between Lewtrenchard Church and Lew Mill. Cllr Southcott reminded members who were on the 3 week general waste collection trials to complete the on-line survey. Cllr Harrop and Southcott received a report of a problem of foul water in the Stoney Croft road. A problem of aging S.W.W. pipework in the main sewer was the cause of the problem.

- It was suggested that clean wipes etc were now getting caught on rusty parts of the pipe-work thus a buildup of wipes etc was causing the pipe to get blocked. Cllr Crocker commented that the problem would only get worse because of all the additional homes due to be built. Clerk to write a letter. Cllr Southcott to write a report of the problem in the Newslink.
- 4. Emergency Plan Draft Emergency plan booklet– Cllr Crocker suggested that a note providing the reasons for the production of the plan is inserted inside the booklet. Cllr Southcott to make amendments to back page. It was resolved to approve the draft E.P with amendments, proposed Cllr Yeo, and seconded Cllr Wilkinson. It was resolved to approve the quote of £210 for the production of the booklet. Proposed Cllr Dawe, seconded Cllr Yeo.
- 5. The Ramps No fund raising has taken place. The clerk confirmed that the land at the Ramps is registered as a 'Village Green' with D.CC. Cllr Perkins to provide details of the proposed play equipment before a planning application is made.
- 6. Snow Warden vacancy response to advertisement It was too early to analyse because adverts were only recently posted. Cllr Harrop suggested that the role could be an "organisational role" rather than an individual role.
- 7. Highways Cllr Dawe reported that there were several deficiencies between Lewtrenchard Church and Lew Mill, Cllr Southcott to inspect and report to highways. Cllr Southcott reported that the closed road near Coryton Station was now listed on Google Maps, improved road signage for diversions due to the road closure was now in place, road repairs due to be completed by the end of March. Cllr Southcott reported that the C822 highway clean up had progressed a little further however more work was still required to complete the job. Cllr Southcott to write to Steve Brockman.
- 8. Correspondence Parishioner planning concerns with Land east of West Headson, Council noted the contents of the correspondence. Letters of appreciation from Lewdown Cricket Club, Lewtrenchard PCC, Marystow PCC, Thrushelton PCC, Citizens Advice, for donations received. Cllr Edmonds (WDBC) provided details of the 2021 grass cutting contract for the West Devon Drive.
- 9. Offer from Lewdown Cricket Club for a game of cricket after the restrictions are lifted. Council agreed that it would be a good opportunity to participate, fund raising possibilities were not yet discussed.

Meeting closed 21.38pm

Next meeting is an Extraordinary meeting 22nd February, 7.30pm, this will be a virtual meeting.

Extraordinary meeting held on Monday 22nd February 2021

- 1. Speeding and Safety concerns on the C822
- 1.a Signage A review of current locations of existing signage and where, if required, new signage should be. Cllr Southcott provided a draft village plan proposing, speed limit and zoning plus warning signage. Proposals were welcomed by all the council, Cllr Ball suggested that on the village signs "Please drive carefully" would also be a beneficial inclusion. Repositioning of the village signs at some of the entrances were also proposed. Cllr Ball and the council thanked Cllr Southcott for the work done on the draft village plan.
- 1.b Speed data Review of current data available and when new survey should be undertaken. There was some speed checking prior to the beginning of government lockdown restrictions however data is also required to show what difference the Wig-Wag lights have made since their introduction, this will be resumed when full lockdown restrictions have been lifted. The latest government traffic policy DTP34/05 dates back to 2013, ClIr Ball is to confirm if this is still the current policy.
- 1.c Properties with road frontages on the C822 Comparisons with what other similar communities with 30mph speed zones have. Cllr Wilkinson produced a comparison summery table of other local towns & villages that have 30mph speed limits, only Sourton had a 40mph speed limit through their village. The summery table provided clear evidence that supported the councils request for the speed limit reduction. Cllr Ball and the council thanked Cllr Wilkinson for the valuable work done on collating the information. Cllr Ball will forward this to Devon Highways. Meg Booth (head of Highways) agreed to look into a review of the D.H. road frontage policy so that it would also deal with issues relating to Lewdown village. Cllr Ball was asked to provide the current definition of the highways frontage.
- 1.d Removal of white lines proposals assessment of D.H. safety data. No data has been provided.
- 1.e Removal of white lines near the Blue Lion. The road is at its narrowest at this point.
- 1.f Draft village gateway improvements This was covered in the draft proposal presented by Cllr Southcott.

Cllr Ball provided value information, these included the following; At a DCC

meeting he confirmed his continued support for the councils request for a speed reduction and increased safety measures. Cllr Ball also confirmed that his meeting with the Head of Highways Meg Booth was also in full support of the parish councils concerns. The comparison evidence provided by Cllr Wilkinson was valuable plus a draft safety measures proposal by Cllr Southcott. There was a lot of work to be done by DCC, unfortunately those processes would mean that any funding for the changes could not be budgeted for in the year 2021-22. Approved alterations would therefore be considered for the budget in the year 2022-23. Cllr Southcott mentioned other trouble spots on the C822, these included blind spots at the junction at Lobhill cross, near the village hall, and Reddicliffs, photos to be sent to Cllr Ball. Cllr Crocker enquired if DCC was aware of current attendee numbers at Lewtrenchard School. Cllr Ball in conjunction with the police has data for accidents, relevant information will be forwarded onto the council.

- 2. Councillor reports: Cllr Southcott thanked Cllr Wilkinson and a parishioner in helping to clean up the road verge. Also mentioned was the 'Road Warden Scheme' this initiative would require volunteers to help clean up the roads through the village. Complaints relating to the building work at the development opposite the school had been received, these have been relayed to WDBC. Cllr Wilkinson informed that the usable width of the pavement from the Victory Hall to the former Police station was reducing in width due to the outward growing of the existing hedgerow. Cllr Dawe asked that when the development was completed could a review of hedge location take place, the chair suggested an appraisal of the pavement, Cllr Wilkinson offered to do this. Cllr Vanstone reported that a main Western Power electric cable was a concern to the hedge cutter because of its low position, clerk to report. Cllr Vanstone also reported highway drainage problems near Thrushelton Church, to be reported on the D.H. website. Cllr Harrop reported that drainage problems in Stoney Lane were reported to S.W.W and were being looked into by them, Cllr Vanstone reported that the problem was still ongoing when severe weather took place. Cllr Perkins asked if she could have some help with the fund raising applications, Cllr Southcott agreed to help out. Cllr Andrews reported that salt/ grit had been supplied by D.H and had been distributed in area's that reported a need of some bags. Storage of surplus bags are held with Cllr Metherell, contact the clerk for further distribution.
- 3. Application Ref- 1642752 to name/number a new street at Crossroads, Lewdown. It was resolved to name the two roads 'Brentor View West' and 'Brentor View North'. The proposal 'Bluebell Way' was thought inappropriate.
- Date & time of next scheduled meeting, 29th March 2021, 7.30pm, this will be a virtual meeting
